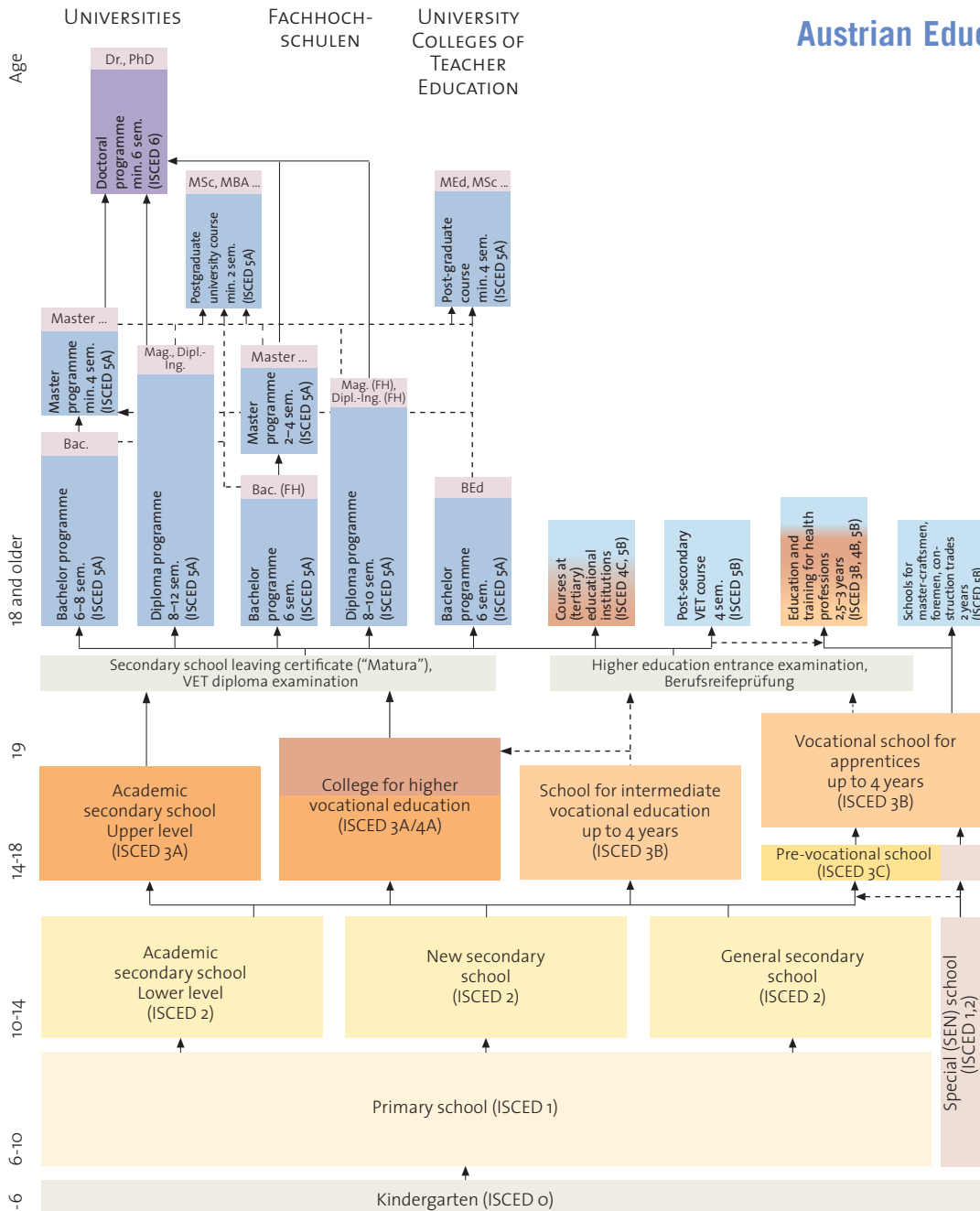

# Preface


Ladies and Gentlemen,

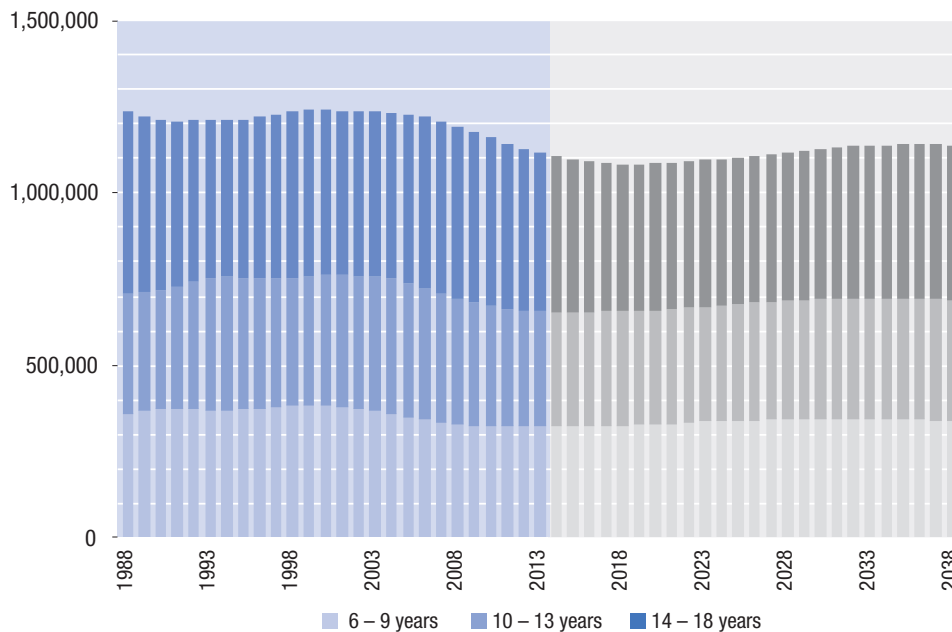

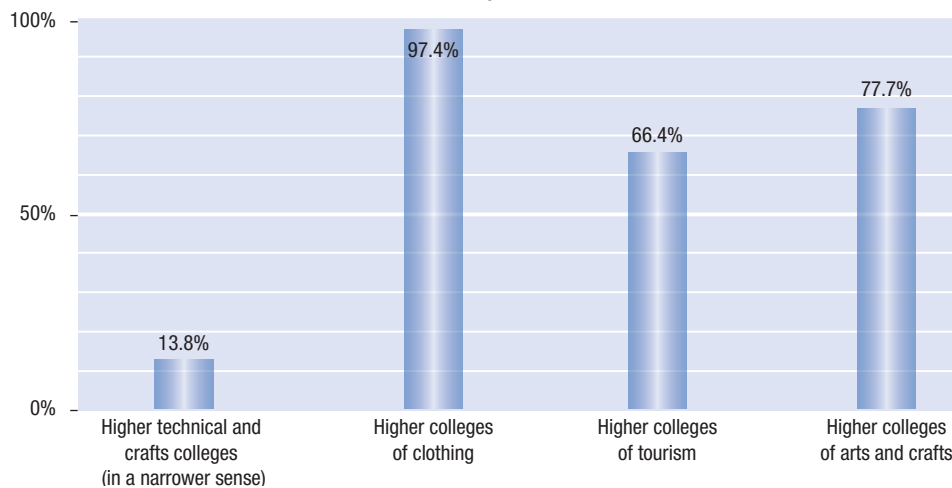

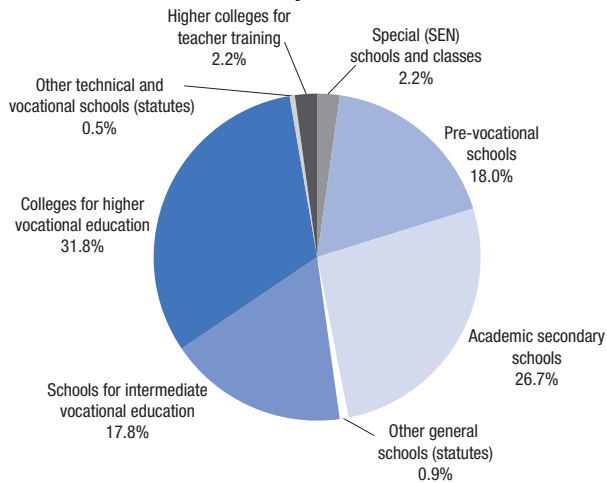

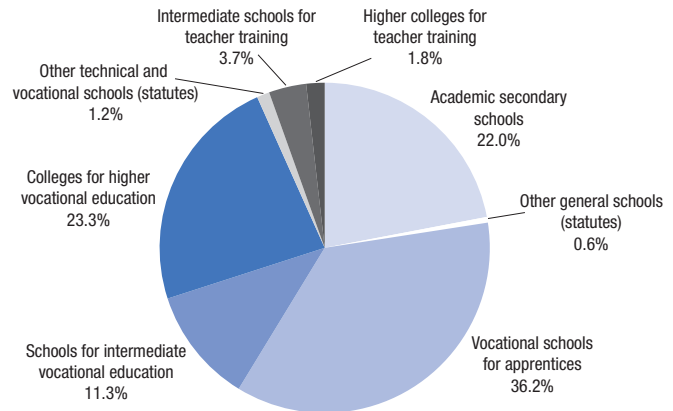
**Proportion of school types at grade 5

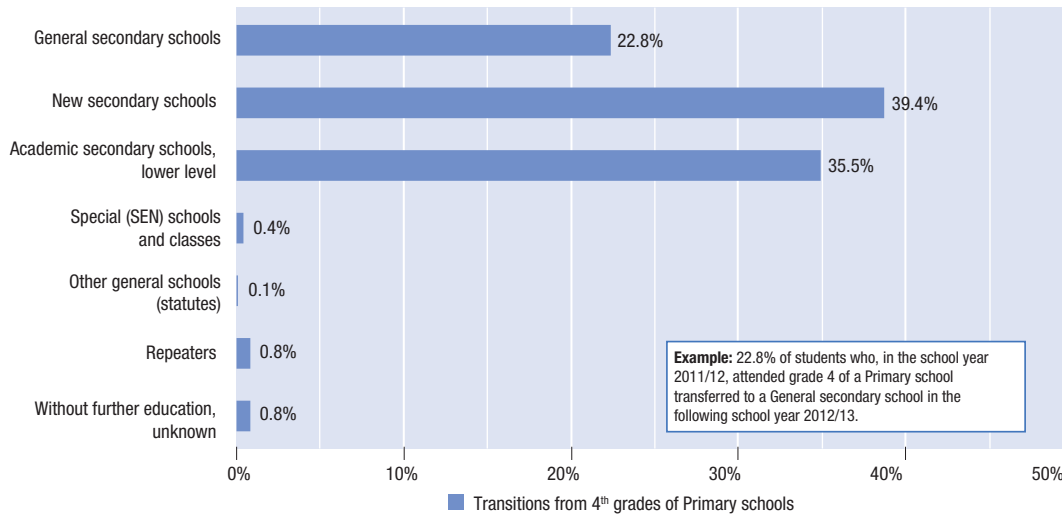

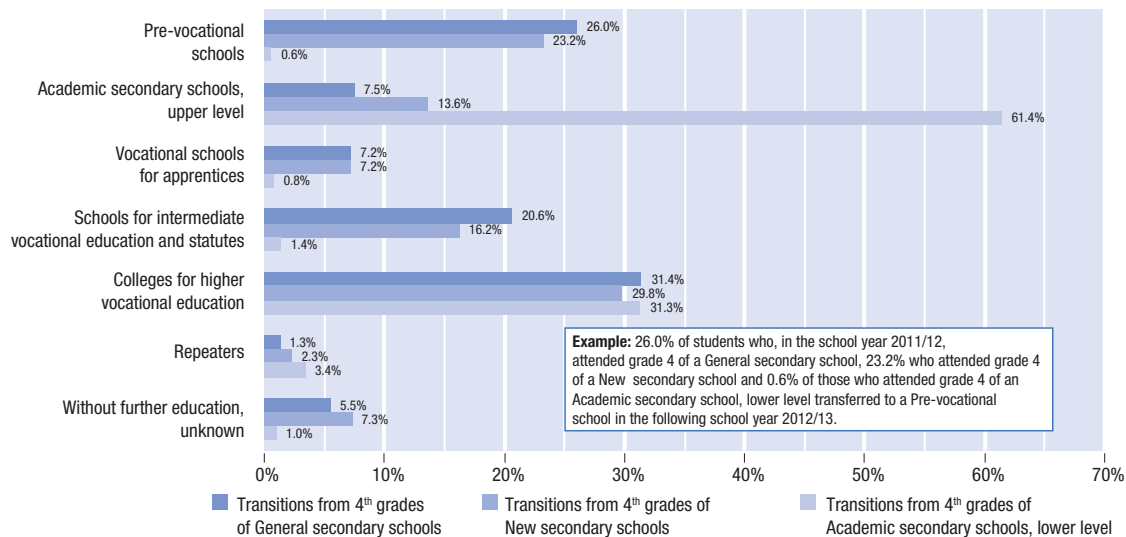
