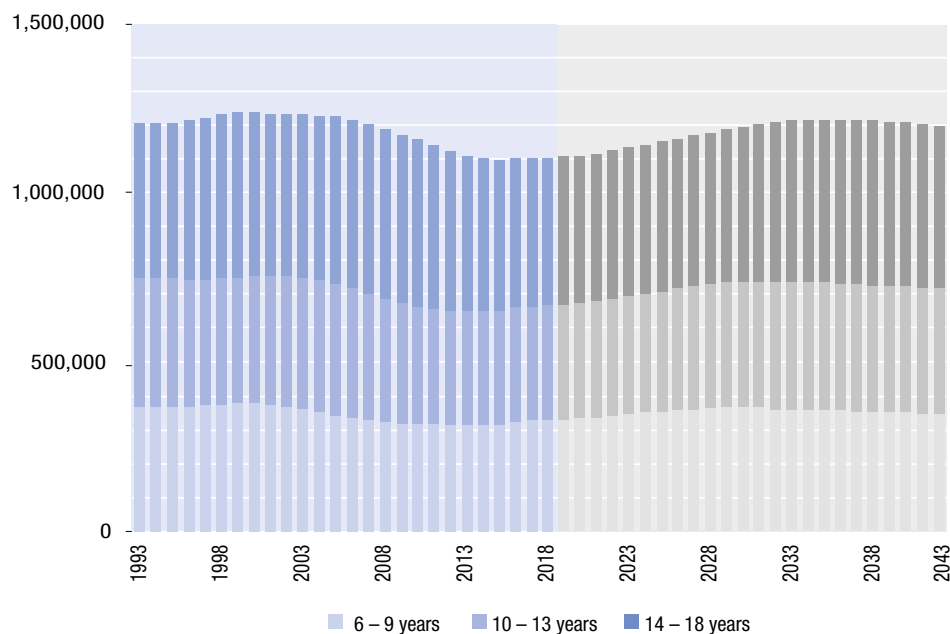

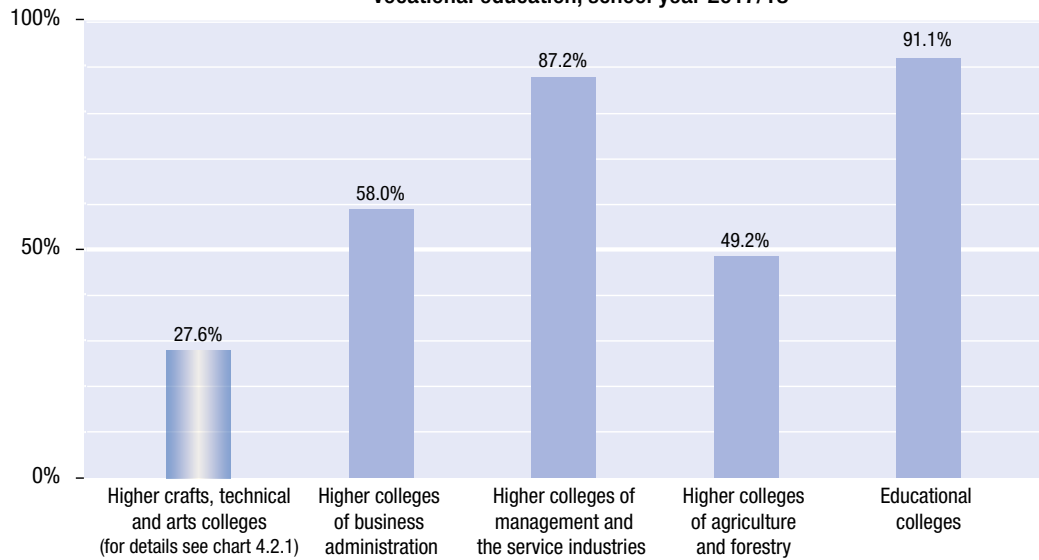

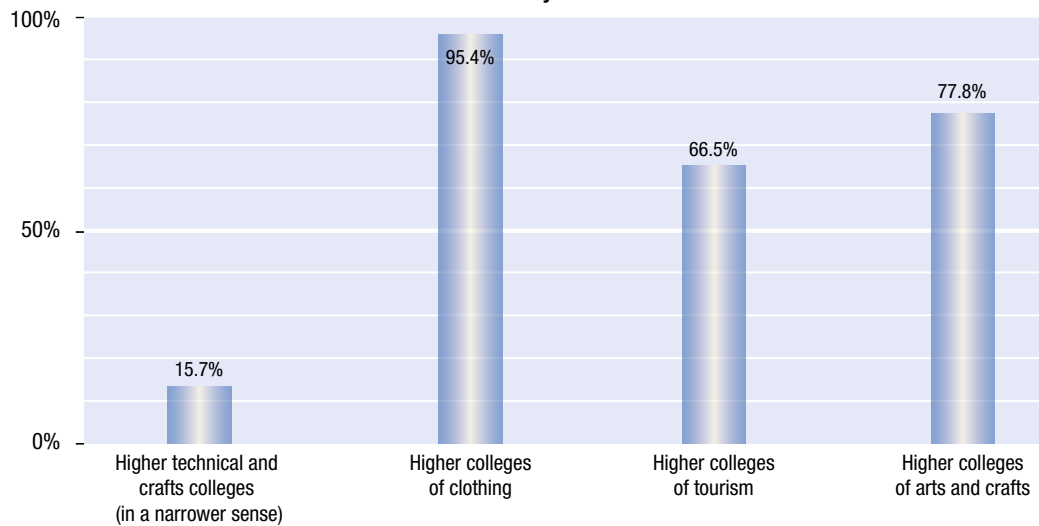




**Chart 4.2: Proportion of female students in the various fields of study at Colleges for higher vocational education, school year 2017/18**

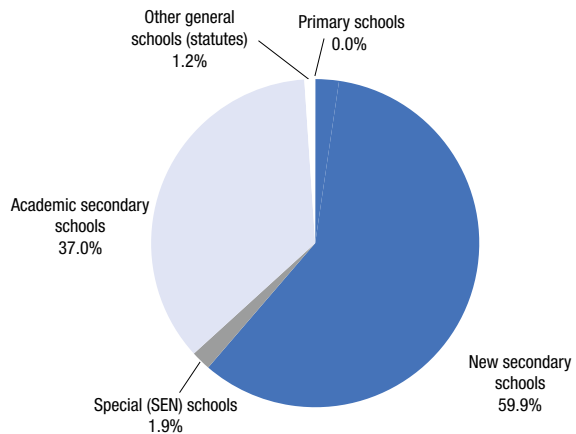

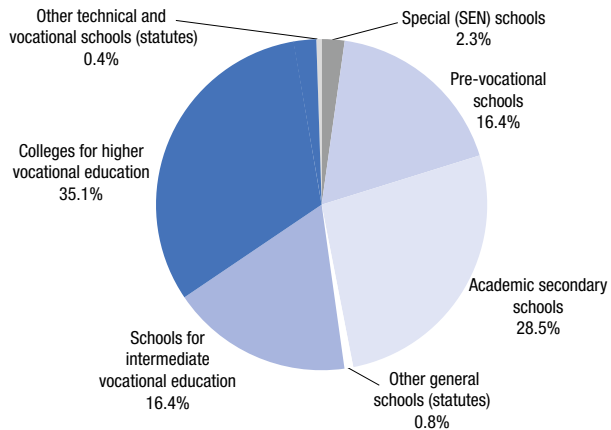

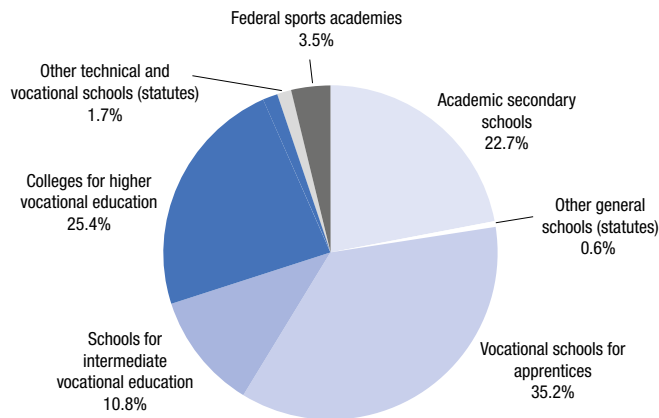
**Proportion of school types at grade 5

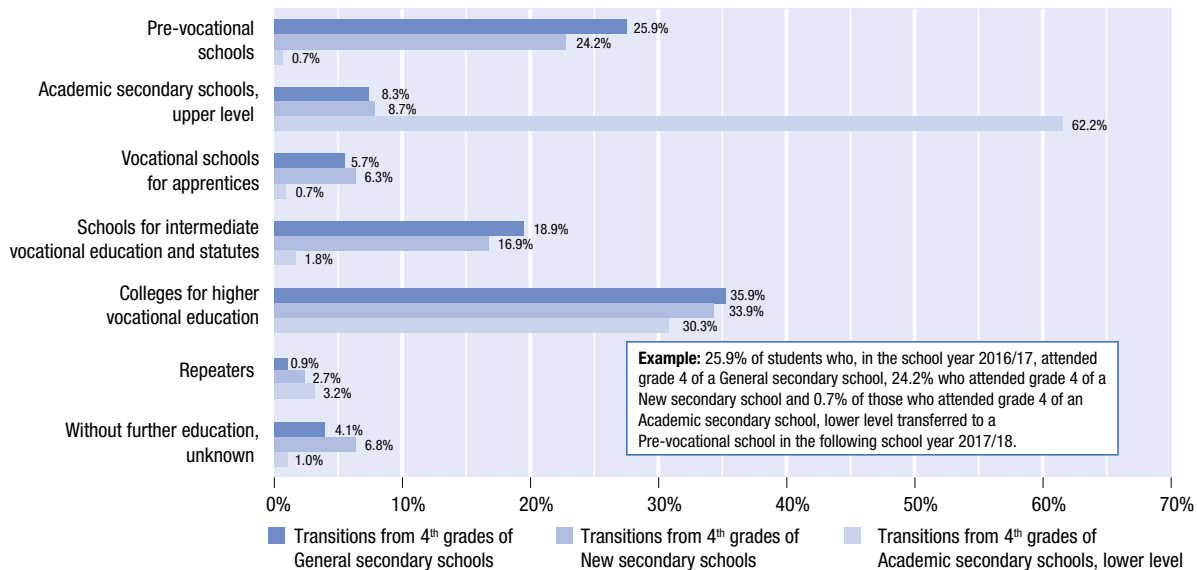
